

In his palace, they must have felt great physical comfort — rest and tables of plenty on what was an otherwise long and treacherous journey.

But if the Maai were honest with themselves, I'll bet they would have admitted that, regardless of Herod's charm, they felt a gnawing sense of doubt while in his presence. When they looked upon the Christ Child, born in a stable without any of the comforts of the world or protections of wealth, they probably felt the opposite. They probably felt safe. The Magi were lucky enough to have the right plan spelled out for them in a dream, but for the rest of us, it's enough to remember this: God's plan is often the one that leads us to places of great simplicity, great humility and great love. Let's have the wisdom to view power with suspicion, and innocence with admiration.


WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

When we gather to celebrate Mass, we are in the Presence of the Lords, should not our dress reflect that we are in a most important event? Let us be respectful of the Lord and one another in how we dress for Mass. AS one pastor noted to his parish..."dress in your best—not Warren Buffet's best– but your Best." A persons trues beauty comes from their dignity of being made in God's image. If anyone wasn't to truly reflect God's beauty, it start with modesty. Proper attire and dressing conservatively shows modesty and true beauty. In order for Mass to be about being in the Presence of our Lord and worshiping with all our hearts, our souls and minds for everyone present, we should not wear items or clothing that will be disturbing to others. For example ladies wearing short skirts, made take someone else's mind away from our Lord.


LIVE THE LITURGY -INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK
