


**GOSPEL SUMMARY: MARK 5:21-24, 35-43**



Your faith has saved her. Imagine the grief of the father of the little girl who is dying. The story is told almost like a play. First, Jairus, the girl's father, comes to Jesus for help; but before he can reach her, people come to say that she has died. Then Jesus goes to the house of Jairus. Jesus takes the girl's hand and says, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" Immediately she stands up and begins to walk around. Imagine the party in Jairus' home that night! Like the crowd in this scene, we may be inclined not to accept the word of Jesus at times. We may think we know better. But Jesus will still remind us of the need to trust him and to have no fear.

**DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR GOSPEL:** Share the imagined feelings of the father, the girl, and the crowd. You may want to volunteer to read aloud and enact the story of Jairus and his daughter. Have you ever felt "stuck"? Have you ever felt, "I don't know how I'm going to do this, or get through this"? Think of a situation like that in your life or in the life of someone you know. Pray quietly for a moment. Like Jairus, you might like to pray, "Jesus, please come." You might like to say this several times. Then imagine Jesus saying your name or the name of the person you are praying for. He says, "\_\_\_\_\_, I say to you, arise!" Jesus is with you and those you love in every situation. He will give you what you need, whether that is more patience, or kindness, or truth, or even a new way to go about things. When you ask Jesus to come, he comes! And when he comes, he brings new life.

**QUESTION OF THE WEEK:** What story about Jesus astounds you?

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION:** The premier poet of the English language, Geoffrey Chaucer, introduced one of his most beloved characters, the "Wife of Bath," by this telling remark: "Husbands at church door she had five." Four times widowed, she was setting off on a pilgrimage, notably without number five. The church door is a curious detail, pointing to the fourteenth-century wedding custom of marrying on the porch of the parish church. The goal was to give maximum publicity to the consent of the groom and bride, and so consent was moved from the bride's home to a public venue. The priest would stand in the doorway and begin by sprinkling the couple with holy water. He needed to make sure they weren't too closely related and give them some instruction. He would direct the groom to pay the bride's family a dowry, and then announce the monetary amounts to the interested passersby. Only then would the guests enter the church for the wedding Mass, during which the bride and groom would hold lighted candles. The gradual move from home to church and the shift from the bride's father to the priest's authority helped to protect the freedom of brides who weren't quite as confident as the Wife of Bath.—Rev. **Did you know.....**The presbyterate of San Diego gained its newest member May 29, with the priestly ordination of Bernardo Lara. The ordination liturgy, celebrated by Bishop Robert W. McElroy, took place at The Immaculata Church on the campus of the University of San Diego. In his homily, Bishop McElroy noted that the occasion brought him "special happiness" because this was the first priestly ordination over which he has presided as bishop of San Diego. He said it also represented "a moment of great happiness for our Church." "This day, Bernardo, you commit yourself to the priesthood of Jesus Christ in service to God's people," Bishop McElroy said. "You have received this calling from the Lord Himself and, during your years of formation, you have contemplated the nature of the priesthood in all of its fullness." The bishop reminded the 25-year-old transitional deacon, who was shortly to become a priest through the laying on of hands and the prayer of ordination, that the priesthood is a vocation of service and that a strong personal relationship with Jesus is needed to carry out that ministry successfully. Bishop McElroy predicted a rewarding life for Father Lara, one that will be marked by great joy, though not without difficulties. "It will be a source of incredible joy to you as you preach the word, celebrate the sacraments and build up the Body of Christ's unity, which is entrusted to your care," he said. "But it will also be a source of challenge and hardship for you at times, as it was for the Lord Himself." Referencing a conversation he had two days earlier with Father Lara, the bishop identified the "three pivotal elements" that had led Father Lara to recognize God's call to the priesthood and to accept it. These included his family, the witness and example of other priests, and the life and ministry of St. John Paul II. St. John Paul, whom Father Lara identified as one of his inspirations, Bishop McElroy told him, "It would be hard to find a better example of priesthood for you as you take up this wonderful vocation to which God has called you." He prayed that the late pope would "constantly intercede" on Father Lara's behalf.
